### **Advent and Christmas**

*Preparing for the coming of Christ*

With the coming of Advent we begin a new Church year. Advent is a season of preparation for the coming of Christ. We all know that during Advent, we prepare for Christmas. People are busy buying gifts, preparing for the coming of guests and cooking special meals. But the preparation that we need most is deeper than this. Advent is about preparing for the coming of Christ into our lives. Yes, Christmas is a celebration of his coming into our world two thousand years ago. But during Advent we are reminded that he still comes to us today and everyday. We need to be ready to meet him. He comes to us through the word of scripture that poignantly touches our heart. He comes to us through the family member who tests our patience. He comes to us through the stranger who is desperate for food and shelter.

We prepare for the coming of Christ as we open our hearts and minds to meet him in unexpected places and people. This summer as I traveled the country, I wrote nightly in my journal about my experiences. I would ask myself the question, "Where have I met Christ today?" My answers were diverse and complicated. Once it was a woman who gave me her flashlight when I was lost in the dark at the Grand Canyon. Once it was the sales clerk at a slow check out line that tested my patience. Once it was a woman at the homeless shelter who simply needed someone to listen to her. Christ comes to us everyday and in many different circumstances. Are we ready to meet him?

During Advent we also prepare for the final coming of Jesus in glory. Jesus himself tells us that no one knows when, where, or how this will be. But what we do know is that the end will not be in death. The final culmination of creation will be life. Christ, the author of life, will come, "not in weakness but in power, and will make all things new." (Book of Common Prayer, p. 862). The end of this life, whether it be the second coming of Jesus or our own mortal death, does not end in darkness. Christ will be there, making all things new. But we must prepare. We must get ready to meet him. And that is what Advent is all about.

### **Christmas Services**

This year we will have festive celebrations of the Holy Eucharist both on Christmas Eve and Christmas morning. We will begin Christmas Eve with a service at 5:00PM with special Christmas music beginning at 4:40PM. This will include Christmas hymns, a Christmas pageant presented by our children, and the Holy Eucharist. There will be no sermon at this service. The pageant will proclaim the gospel in its full glory. Our Midnight Mass will begin at 11:00PM with special Christmas music from the choir beginning at 10:30PM. This service will be a traditional celebration with hymns, Holy Scripture, a sermon, and the Holy Eucharist. On Christmas morning, the celebration will continue with the Holy Eucharist at 10:00AM. We will not have an 8:00AM service on this Sunday. The 10:00AM service will include music and hymns. This service will offer a simple, yet meaningful, Christmas celebration.

## Offering for Haitian Cathedral

When Haiti was struck by the earthquake almost two years ago, the Holy Trinity Cathedral, the spiritual home of the Haitian Episcopalians, was destroyed. When I visited Cange, Haiti, in the summer of 2010, we began our visit in Port-au-Prince with a visit to the cathedral sight. All that was left of a once glorious cathedral were the ruins of a few walls. Once, this cathedral was home to beautiful murals depicting the stories of the Christian faith. These paintings were created by the Haitian people using an artistic style which is characteristic of their heritage.

Now the Episcopal Church has committed to build a new cathedral. On the second and third Sunday of Advent (December 4<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>), our Bishop has asked us to take an additional collection for building the new cathedral in Port-au-Prince. This collection will be a symbol of our love for our brothers and sisters in Haiti and our solidarity with them in this time of rebuilding. As Christian we are called to stand with each other in good times and bad, supporting and encouraging each other. This is what we are now called to do.

This new cathedral will serve as the spiritual home of over 100,000 people. In Haiti, the Church not only provides spiritual nurture but it also provides food, education, and healthcare. As we support the church, we build up all of these ministries. And as we build the bricks and mortar, we share the good news of Jesus Christ. As the cathedral rises out of the rubble, the people of Haiti will be reminded that even when disaster strikes, Christ is among them, offering his hope, sharing his love, renewing with his life. Please make an effort to be in Church December 4<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> to share in this vital ministry.
